CHAIRPERSON'S REPORT

HPMI had a very successful year in 2023. HPMI's delivery of **CPD** continued to be of a high standard, attracting high numbers of attendees, approximately **3500** at 207 events. This has been in no small part due to the outstanding program designed by our Program Committee. I wish to thank this hard-working Committee, along with our greatest resource, our local Speakers, who freely donate their time. HPMI is also extremely grateful to Dr Milton Sales, Program Committee Chair, and the HPMI Medical Education Co-ordinator, Dr Ehsan Mozafari for their help in running HPMI events. Thanks also goes to HPMI's IT Support person, Mr Steve James, for his development of readily accessible online education, including courses and resources.

HPMI has been able to continue with this quality, affordable Continuing Professional Development (**CPD**), thanks to our Major Stakeholders, HPMI Sponsors and the local health professionals taking out Membership.

Hunter New England Local Health District – HPMI continues to promote HealthPathways to the health professionals in our region on their behalf, in partnership with Hunter New England and Central Coast PHN. HPMI also provide JMOs with free membership.

Hunter New England and Central Coast Primary Health Network – This organisation's generous support enabled HPMI to provide affordable CPD to General Practitioners, Practice Nurses, Aged Care Nurses, GP administration staff and Community nurses in the Hunter, New England, and Central Coast regions. It also enabled rural and remote practices to participate in our education, both face to face and via live streaming, or access to videos after the event on HPMI's website. In 2023, the PHN provided scholarships to 11 practices from rural areas to cover their HPMI Memberships. HPMI also continued to co-advertise events with the PHN.

Valley to Coast Charitable Trust continued to support Memberships for GP Trainees in 2023 as well as providing Sponsorship for the HPMI Update Series and continued support of Live Streaming Events and the HPMI Cluster Meetings. Valley to Coast Charitable Trust has also provided funding for the HPMI Medical Education Co-ordinator to take pressure off the Program Committee Chair.

In 2023 HPMI held \$52,504 more in funds than in 2022. The Honorary Treasurer's Report outlines more information regarding HPMI's financial situation.

The 2023 HPMI Newcastle Weekend was held on Saturday 5 and 6 August at NEX, King Street Newcastle West. This meeting was held as a mainly face to face event with longer panel sessions for more of an interactive event. There were 117 registrants in attendance and 15 online for Saturday morning lectures. The 2023 HPMI Weekend attracted more General Practitioners than in previous years.

HPMI was also the conference organiser for the third Immunology Crossroads Conference in 2023 in Newcastle. Professor Lechner-Scott was the convenor and organised a very successful event with over 130 participants

HPMI has plans to hold another International Geriatric Medicine Conference in 2024 which will be a larger 5-day International Conference to be held in October.

QUALITY IMPROVEMENT & CONTINUING PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

During 2023, the Hunter Postgraduate Medical Institute (HPMI) continued its successful provision of independent Quality Improvement and Continuing Professional Development (QI&CPD) to the Health Profession in our region.

HPMI is an Accredited Provider of QI&CPD for both the Royal Australian College of General Practitioners (RACGP) and the Australian College of Remote and Rural Medicine (ACRRM).

The Medical Board of Australia (MBA) changed the requirements for General Practitioners from 2023. It is now a requirement for General Practitioners to participate in different types of CPD activities, including a mix of educational activities (knowledge and skills), measuring outcomes and reviewing performance. Most of HPMI activities are accredited as educational activities (EA). When possible HPMI will incorporate the different types of CPD.

HPMI adheres strictly to RACGP and ACRRM Guidelines regarding sponsorship and maintains an ethical relationship with sponsors in relation to the delivery of education, which is completely independent of sponsoring organizations.

ONLINE STREAMING

HPMI offered live streaming of most events during 2023 thanks to support from Valley to Coast Charitable Trust. Video recordings of most HPMI meetings are also available via HPMI's website for those HPMI Members who are unable to attend.

HEALTHPATHWAYS

Access to Hunter and New England HealthPathways, a web-based information portal supporting primary care clinicians to plan patient care through primary, community and secondary health care systems, is available via HPMI's website. It is like a 'care map' so that all members of a health care team – whether they work in a hospital or the community - can be on the same page when it comes to looking after a particular person. HealthPathways are designed to be used at the point of care, primarily for General Practitioners, but are also available to Hospital Specialists, Nurses, Allied Health, and other Health Professionals within Hunter & New England. In 2023 there were **780** HealthPathways links via HPMI events housed in HPMI Seminar archives via HPMI Online.

PATIENTINFO

Patient info is a health information portal and aims to help people understand and manage their health conditions. **53 Patient info** links have been included on HPMI's website for health Professionals to access for their patients.

ONLINE EDUCATION

HPMI EDUCATION WEBSITE

Although a common procedure, it is invasive with the potential to cause discomfort or even injury to the patient. Certificates of Completion provided.

This Course, incorporated with practical teaching sessions on Mirena Insertion, offers extra information and assessment necessary to attain Certificate of Completion.

HPMI SUSTAINABLE HEALTH AWARDS

HPMI annually awards two prizes to students enrolled in Year 3 of the Joint Medical Programs who are members of HPMI. Winners' reports, and presentations at HPMI AGMs, since 2013, are housed on HPMI's website.

HUNTER HEALTH MEMOIRS - 1920 ONWARDS

Free access to audio recordings of interviews, originally made by Dr Steve De Lyall, with several prominent Newcastle Medicos. Professor Alan Hewson continued to update memoir contributions with video recordings until 2017. This compilation of first-hand accounts and unbelievable tales will go down in the history books as 85 years of doctors who built the world of medicine in the Newcastle region. Access to memoirs is freely available via our website, however, donations are happily received. It is also possible to purchase an MP3 of original audio recordings for \$22 from HPMI.

The memoirs are first-hand accounts from doctors who made a unique contribution to medical history covering the period when medical knowledge – and practice – was expanded explosively after WW2 in Newcastle. These interviews are a fascinating resource for anyone interested in the background of the medical practice of today's doctors. HPMI has now begun video recording other practitioners for posterity.

At the **200 Years of a Hospital in Newcastle conference** held in 2017, Professor Alan Hewson, Dr Peter Hendry and Dr Owen James were honoured. Recordings of this are included with their Memoir contributions. The other History Meetings are available online as well via the Hunter History tab.

OPIOID PODCASTS FOR GPs

Dr David Outridge, a General Practitioner from Valley Medical Practice, Waratah, has designed podcasts series on Opioid Dependence in association with HPMI. There are a total of 20 Podcasts.

WEBSITE HOSTING

Antibiotic Module – GP Synergy

HPMI has been approached to host modules on our website. Previously we had worked with General Practice Training Valley to Coast to host the Trainee education modules on our site. After GPTVTC became defunct these modules remained but weren't accessed. This year we were approached by GP Synergy to host an Antibiotic Education Online Module for Registrars and GP Supervisors. HPMI was paid for Steve James to upload this module and for HPMI to host these modules.

iSISTAQUIT

HPMI was approached by the University last triennium to apply for points for the SISTAQUIT project as well as to host their Online module of the SISTAQUIT project. In 2023, Southern Cross University took over this project and approached HPMI to continue to host their module with a few changes.


