LEARNING OUTCOMES

- Describe the epidemiology, terminology and clinical impact of Metabolic Dysfunction–Associated Steatotic Liver Disease and its relationship to metabolic risk factors.
- Identify patients at increased risk of MASLD in general practice, including those with Type 2 Diabetes, Hypertension, Dyslipidaemia and features of Metabolic Syndrome.
- Outline appropriate investigation pathways for suspected MASLD, including interpretation of liver function tests and the role of imaging.
- Apply non-invasive risk stratification tools in primary care to identify patients at risk of progressive liver disease such as Nonalcoholic Steatohepatitis, Liver Fibrosis and Cirrhosis.
- Implement evidence-based management strategies including lifestyle modification and optimisation of cardiometabolic risk factors.
- Recognise when specialist referral is indicated for further assessment and management of patients with suspected advanced liver disease.
- Recognise presentations of inflammatory bowel disease
- Classify and interpret investigations of inflammatory bowel disease
- Clarify monitoring and risks of IBD therapy
- Describe the principles and emerging evidence for Faecal Microbiota Transplantation and its role in restoring the gut microbiome.
- Identify current clinical indications for FMT, particularly in the management of recurrent Clostridioides difficile infection.
- Recognise appropriate patient selection and referral pathways for FMT in patients with recurrent or treatment-refractory infection.
- Discuss the potential benefits, risks, and safety considerations associated with FMT, including donor screening and infection control measures.
- Outline emerging research and potential future applications of FMT in conditions such as Inflammatory Bowel Disease, Irritable Bowel Syndrome and metabolic disorders.
- Provide appropriate patient counselling regarding FMT, including expectations, safety considerations, and access to specialist services.
